In Person vs. Online Courses at Laurier		
Feature	In Person Classes	Online Courses at Luther/Laurier
Design	On-campus courses that you must attend class in person.	Originally and intentionally designed as an online course .
Identification	TH course code <u>without VA or VS designation</u> means it is in person at Luther.	You can identify an online course on LORIS by checking the section. Virtual Asynchronous online courses are marked VA . Virtual Synchronous are VS .
Class Meetings & Format	Usually a 3 hour class once per week for a 12 week term or Intensive format. As we are CRPO regulated, missing classes means you are missing required content (professional competencies) and is not permitted (unless under extreme circumstances). “Intensive” format means it is in person at Luther but does not run the standard format 3 hours once per week. Intensive courses run full days for 5-6 days (please check your syllabus). Intensive days/times are not posted in LORIS. Please see this Luther link for dates/times .	Virtual Asynchronous (VA) do not include regularly scheduled class meeting times. VA course instruction will occur asynchronously, while Virtual Synchronous courses (VS) are delivered at a specific day and time. VA courses may occasionally include 1 or 2 scheduled components for virtual interaction, such as for getting to know your professor and classmates. Some online courses may also include a requirement to regularly meet with a peer group .

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT REGISTERING FOR COURSES

- **NOTE:** Dates/times/locations for courses held in the Fall and Winter terms can be found on LORIS.
 - To find the days/times of “Intensive” courses, see [Courses at Luther](#).
- In LORIS, we recommend putting in the term (Fall 2025) and then adding in the subject (Theology) and then searching (don’t add the course code) so that all the courses come up for you.
- Unless noted otherwise, all courses are worth 0.5 credits.
- Students should register **early** for their courses. Courses fill up quickly, so registering early will help you get into the required courses.
- Keep in mind that **some courses do not run every year**, so be sure to **connect with your Advisor about your course progression plan**.
- Full Time students typically complete the degree in 3 years. Those with advanced standing may complete the degree more quickly.

NOTE ABOUT INTENSIVE COURSES, TIME MANAGEMENT & BUDGETING

Please keep in mind that when taking “Intensive” courses, you will need to do preparation work (such as completing readings) before the start of the course. We suggest giving yourself **at least a week** in advance of the course, but **ideally 2-3 weeks**, to complete this preparation work.

We also encourage you to consider budgeting time and money for your own personal therapy during your studies, particularly before Practicum.

PRACTICUM PLACEMENT & REQUIRED COURSES

Students must complete a minimum of eight courses, including all pre-requisite courses for the Practicum, before beginning their Placement.

Placement typically occurs in the second or third year of the dual degree Full-Time program. It's important to note that part-time students also require a minimum of 8 courses, including all the pre-requisite courses, before undertaking their Practicum Placement. For Part Time students, Placement typically occurs in the fourth or fifth year of the program.

- Make sure you complete all the pre-requisites for the Practicum I and Practicum II courses (TH664M & TH664Q) or SPE course (TH652A) before starting your Placement. Students can **NOT** do both an SPE and Practicum Placement during the program; choose one or the other.
 - If taking Practicum, ensure that you enroll in the same course section (A, B, C, or D) of Practicum I and Practicum II for each term.
- Some Placements require specific electives. Any questions should be directed to Clinical Practicum Coordinator, Sarah Ciotti.
- Pre-requisites for Practicum (and SPE) are shaded in **green** in the Checklist below.
 - Pre-requisites can **NOT** be taken concurrently with Placement.

PLACEMENTS WITH A SPRING (MAY) START

- If you are starting your Practicum Placement in **May, you must register in TH664M in the Spring term to be covered by the university's liability insurance.** You will still also register in TH664M for the Fall term. Classroom sessions for TH664M will not start until the Fall.
 - If starting your Placement in May, we recommend limiting your courseload to **TWO** courses (in addition to TH664M).
 - Please note that although there is no coursework, taking TH664M in Spring **does count toward your overall courseload.**
As a reminder, Part Time students have a courseload of 1-2 courses, and Full Time students have a course load of 3-4 courses.
- Once your practicum placement is finalized, complete your Learning Covenant (more information can be found in the [Luther Hub](#)). Once completed, **upload your Learning Covenant to your TH664M Spring course.**
- You will need to resubmit the Learning Covenant to your respective TH664M instructor in the Fall term.

Days/Times are subject to change. Be sure to check that the days and times on LORIS before registering to ensure they have not changed. You can also use the [LORIS Visual Schedule Builder](#) tool to make your planning easier.

OVERALL PROGRAM CHECKLIST

Please note that some courses are only offered every other year. These courses are noted in **blue**. You should take these courses **whenever they are offered**, so you don't miss them. Some courses also have pre-requisites or other considerations. These are noted in **yellow**.

NOTE: You will see the course **TH664H** listed twice in the checklist; this is because it is required by and counts toward both the MDiv side and the MA SCP side of the dual degree. You will only take the course once.

NOTE: For students who choose the **Contextual Option**, there are certain courses you need to complete before you can take TH681 Internship. These courses are noted in **pink**.

Other Required Courses (Practicum)

TH664M & TH664Q – Practicum I & Practicum II are two 0.5 credit courses that you take in the Fall and Winter of your second year. You take these courses as you are also working at your placement site. There are 4 sections to choose from: A, B, C or D.

You are required to **register in the SAME SECTION for both Practicum I and Practicum II**, so that you are in the same class with the same instructor for both Fall and Winter terms. Please be sure to pay close attention to this when registering for classes.

TH652A – Supervised Pastoral Education is a 1.0 credit course that you can take in an intensive format (1 term) or extended format (2 terms). If you choose to take **TH652A**, you do not attend class at Luther. Classes are held at your SPE location.

Pre-requisites for TH664M and TH652A are:

- One course from the Psychotherapy and Counselling Courses section (TH663L, TH663M, TH663Z or TH664O)
- Any other one Counselling course
- TH664H – Professional Studies and Ethics
- TH663Y – Assessment
